Q1. Compare the philosophy of general classification with library classification. Support your answer with relevant examples.

General classification is a broad categorization system used across various disciplines to organize knowledge systematically. It includes scientific classification (taxonomy), social classification (demographics), and commercial classification (industry sectors). Library classification, on the other hand, is specifically designed to organize books and other information resources in a structured manner for easy retrieval. Examples include the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) and Library of Congress Classification (LCC). While general classification serves broader knowledge organization, library classification is tailored to ensure efficient library management.

Q2. Describe the purpose and usage principles of Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) index, schedules, and tables with examples.

The DDC system organizes knowledge into ten main classes, further divided into divisions and sections. The index provides an alphabetical list of topics and their corresponding classification numbers. The schedules contain the hierarchical structure of subjects, and tables allow for notation expansion. For instance, 300 (Social Sciences) expands into 320 (Political Science) and 321 (Systems of Government).

Q3. Describe the purpose, grammar, and usage principles of Sears List of Subject Headings (SLSH) with relevant examples.

The Sears List of Subject Headings (SLSH) standardizes library cataloging by assigning consistent subject terms. It follows specific grammatical rules, such as singular nouns for topics (e.g., "Library" instead of "Libraries") and inverted names for personal subjects (e.g., "Shakespeare, William"). Its usage principles ensure clarity and consistency, aiding users in information retrieval. Q4. There are some limitations in the DDC system with regard to coverage of oriental subjects. Highlight such limitations and suggest a viable solution thereto with relevant examples.

The DDC system has been criticized for its Eurocentric bias, with inadequate representation of Eastern philosophies, religions, and literatures. For example, while Western philosophy is classified under 100, Eastern philosophies are grouped into fewer subclasses. A viable solution is the introduction of expanded notation within the DDC system to allow for more granular classification of non-Western subjects.

Book number/author mark principles: Book numbers distinguish books within a classification by using Cutter numbers or author marks.

Types of notation: Library classification uses hierarchical, enumerative, and faceted notations, such as numeric (DDC) and alphanumeric (LCC).
